THREE DANGERS - MEMORIALS AT RISK

Traditionally understood War Memorails are at risk of being vandalised, eroded or just being neglected. Rolls of Honour and plaques are being vandalised, negligently disposed of, thrown away or destroyed. Some names have been omitted, others are not being added to Existing War Memorials. Some new Memorials need to be commissioned.

FRIENDS OF WAR MEMORIALS MARITIME DIVISION -Rev. Andrew Phillips looks after War Graves under the sea. Commander Josh Cosnett organizes the very necessary FoWM's National Heritage Memorial Hospital Trust. Tony Martin efficiently runs the Scottish War Memorial Group. He is one of our Trustees.

The Transport Trust, Lambeth Road, are essential because Transport changes often lead to rolls of honour being forgotten. The Commonwealth War Graves Commission whose web-site Debt of Honour register; <u>www.cwgc.org</u>; is such a help. They ask us to deal with things outside their remit. ENGLISH HERITAGE and Friends of War Memorials are now actively seeking a Conservation Officer with the help from the Esmee Fairbairn Trust

The Burma Star Association, are our generous landlords. Various Regimental Groups are in constant touch.

The Civic Trust and the Countryside Commission, unstintingly help our cause.

The Objectives of FoWM are:

- To monitor the condition of War Memorials and to take steps to ensure that local authorities and other relevant organizations are alerted to such conditions with a view to their undertaking any necessary cleaning, restoration, maintenance, repairs and renovations.
- To liaise with ecclesiastical authorities, regiments and other responsible bodies with a view to their accepting responsibility for, and undertaking repairs and renovations of, War Memorials.
- 3. To educate, inform and publicise the spiritual, archaeological and historical significance of war memorials as part of our national heritage, to encourage support groups and to inspire young people to cherish their local war memorials and the memory of those who sacrificed their lives in the cause of freedom.

What are FoWM's other activities?

FoWM will act as a focal point for information on British War Memorials overseas which may be under threat and will take practical and appropriate measures for their protection and refurbishment, or if necessary, repatriation.

The Trust will help to find suitable settings at schools, colleges and public buildings for those monuments which it has been necessary to rescue from their original sites.

FoWM may be able to give limited assistance to families, friends and organizations who are seeking information on War Memorials or on those who are commemorated. Alternatively it may be able to direct them to other appropriate authorities.


