In response to the release of The Victorian Society's Top Ten Most Endangered Victorian and Edwardian Buildings in England and Wales 2014 War Memorials Trust adds its voice to the call for the Crimean war memorial to be returned to public display.

This memorial is an important link to the past reminding us of our history and remembering those who fell in service. War Memorials Trust has held discussions with the council over many years and hopes that the time is now right for them to work with others to ensure this memorial is available again for all to appreciate and visit to pay their respects. The project may be eligible for funding from grant schemes run by War Memorials Trust and the charity would be delighted to work with the council, and others, on this project.
